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APGO members come together twice a year: once in January for the APGO Martin L. Stone, MD, Faculty Development Seminar, which offers faculty members innovative educational tools to enhance their teaching techniques; and again in February/March for the CREOG & APGO Annual Meeting, which brings together department chairs, residency directors, clerkship directors, faculty, residents, medical students and clerkship and residency coordinators to present educational research in the form of oral abstracts, poster presentations, and general sessions. This meeting focuses on improving medical education for students and residents.

The relationship with ACE, and other ob-gyn organizations, allows APGO the opportunity to collaborate and foster partnerships, share resources and network for the overall benefit of women's health care education.

APGO Emphasis on Faculty Development

APGO offers many teaching and learning tools in support of its mission to promote faculty development. They include the following programs: Faculty Development Seminar, Clerkship Directors' School, Academic Scholars and Leaders Program, and Surgical Educators Scholars Program. Furthermore, APGO rewards members with annual awards designed to acknowledge and encourage continued excellence in women's health education.

APGO is proud to sponsor award programs that play a major role in the advancement of health care for women. Over the years, these endowments have helped APGO further faculty development, educational research activities, innovative new curricula and an outstanding collection of women's health care publications. Current research and grant programs include Medical Education Endowment Grants, International Scholarships and Resident Scholars.

APGO Annual Meeting

APGO welcomed osteopathic schools and departments into full membership in 2012. At the 2013 Annual Meeting, the American College of Osteopathic Residency Directors met in conjunction with the Annual Meeting. Over 70 osteopathic residency program directors attended the meeting; for many it was their first CREOG & APGO Annual Meeting. Osteopathic educators have had an active ACOOG representative on APGO's Undergraduate Medical Education Committee (UMEC) since 1999. In alignment with the integration of our osteopathic colleagues into educational leadership, 10th edition of the APGO Medical Student Educational Objectives will include a new section for osteopathic educators. This section will outline principles not traditionally included in allopathic education such as incorporation of osteopathic techniques into the evaluation and treatment of back pain in pregnancy and postpartum depression.
